Workshop Description:

In this session, we will discuss how to be active agents for inclusion. We will look at three domains:

- Staff to Staff interactions: skills and tools for creating an effective culture of dialogue that can have productive conversations about difficult or controversial issues
- Curriculum Impact: how might we ensure that our curriculum is not inadvertently biased and that we are teaching a wide variety of perspectives
- Student Impact: skills and tools for addressing student concerns, conversations, problematic interactions, and, most importantly, how to create an inclusive environment for all children in our schools and classrooms
